Inclement Weather Information

Cold Weather

The cold weather is here and having warm clothing helps to keep everyone healthy and happy. Warm coats and mittens always help on cooler days, and having a pair of inside shoes to warm cold feet is wonderful too. For younger students, having a spare set of clothing at school or in a backpack is helpful when clothing gets wet. Personal Electronic Devices

If you send your child to school with a cell phone, iPod, or other electronic device, please remind them that the device must be turned off and in their backpack during class time. This also includes not taking, sharing, or uploading images of another individual without his or her permission. The school is not responsible for any lost or damaged devices. Head Lice Awareness

Outbreaks of head lice are common throughout the school year. Although head lice are a bother, head lice are not a health risk. Head lice spread quickly by close, headto-head contact. Lice cannot live on furniture or carpet, and they cannot jump or fly. There may be few or no symptoms, but itching may occur.

You can help by:

- Checking your child's head with the wet-combing method of detection once a week throughout the school year.
- Encouraging your child to wear their hair tied back.
- Using the wet-combing method of treatment if you notice live lice on your child's head.
- Reminding family and friends about the importance of routine head checks using the wet combing method.
