Khowhemun Elementary School Positive Behaviour Support

F.A.Q.'s about our school's Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) System.

1. What is PBS?

Our school has adopted a common code of conduct (displayed in the matrix we call "Our Code in Action" which is on the other side of this sheet) that outlines the expectations for students. We have designed the system that clearly shows students how to behave in all of the areas of the school. Our staff encourage positive behaviour by acknowledging students when they show behaviour that follows the 3 B's.

2. How does this affect me as a parent?

Your support is necessary for our school's system to be successful and effective. Be proud of your child's positive behaviour and be willing to discuss problem situations if and when they arise.

3. What are these little golden tickets my child keeps getting?

Khowhemun Staff recognize students when we catch them practicing the 3 B's (Be Safe, Be Responsible and Be Respectful). Children are given a golden ticket when they are "caught" doing the 3 B's so he/she can be entered into the weekly draw and so you can acknowledge his/her positive behaviour. Encourage your child to tell you if they received a ticket and what they received it for.

4. Yikes, my child brought home a "Pink Sheet!" Now what?

Remain calm. If your child received a Pink Sheet, either an adult has had to talk to your child about problem behaviour frequently or the behaviour was serious enough to warrant an office referral. Talk it over, sign the pink sheet and send it back with your child. The important part is that your child learns how to behave positively.

Our hope is that by having concrete rules, reinforcements and learning, students will understand the expectations at Khowhemun.
